## **Life Application:**

- 2. Jesus went away to spend time with God in prayer, but then he also went to do what the Father had for him to do. How do we balance our time between being away with God and doing what God has called us to do?
- 3. What are some of the things you feel our church and community needs prayer for? How can we pray more regularly for the health of our church and community?
- 4. Have you ever done a prayer walk? What seems exciting about it? What seems scary about it?
